Engelbert Humperdinck's Hansel and Gretel


Engelbert Humperdinck (ok, is that the coolest name ever or what?) composed the "Fairy Tale Opera" Hansel and Gretel in 1892. Based on the Grimm brothers' tale, the libretto was written by Engelbert's sister Adelheid Wette. Premiered on December 23rd 1893 and first conducted by Richard Strauss, it has always been associated with Christmas and is full of folk-and-whimsically inspired themes.

Known best for Hansel and Gretel, Humperdinck was born in Siegburg, Prussia in 1854. After studying music in Germany, a scholarship allowed him to continue his studies in Italy where he met Richard Wagner. He then taught in Frankfurt and Barcelona before composing Hansel and Gretel in addition to other choral works, operas and incidental music. He continued teaching until his death in 1921.

Fun Facts:



In 1923, the Royal Opera House at Covent Garden in London, chose *Hänsel und Gretel* for their first complete radio broadcast.

Silent Night Inspired A Truce During World War I. On Christmas Eve 1914, British troops spotted Christmas trees on the German side of the fight and heard soldiers singing "Stille Nacht." They responded by singing the English lyrics. The truce lasted until after Christmas on Dec. 26th.
